About GGCS

RGGOs are issued to green gas producers for units of green gas injected into the gas grid. They can then be transferred between a variety of counterparties before being cancelled and allocated to gas consumers.

The GGCS ensures that only one RGGO is issued for each unit injected, that they are transferred securely, and only ever allocated to one consumer. By doing so we provide certainty that green gases are not double counted.

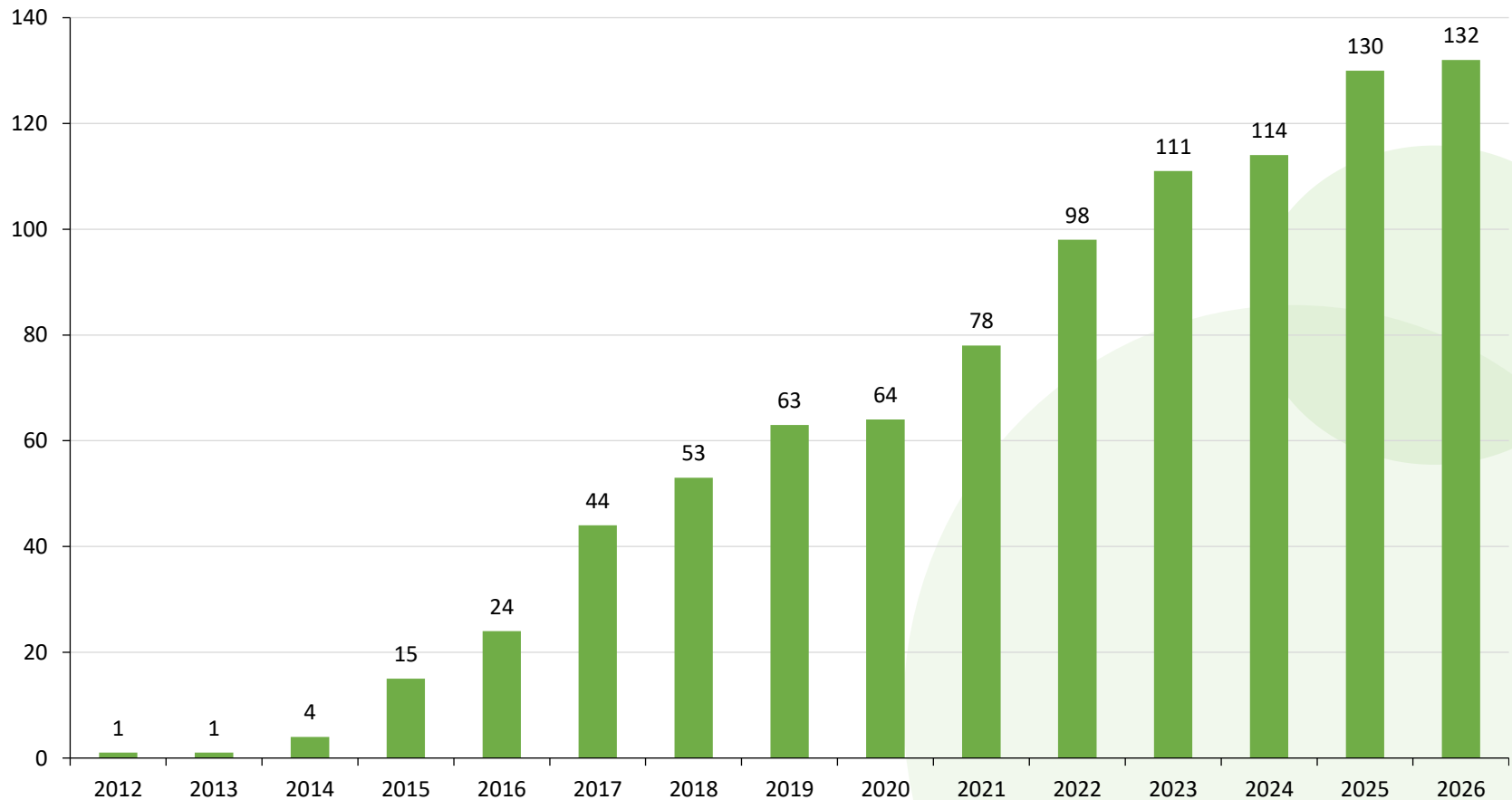
RGGOs are a simple and reliable way for green gas producers to capture the value of their product, enabling companies and households to support biomethane production in the UK and, where applicable, lower their reported carbon emissions.

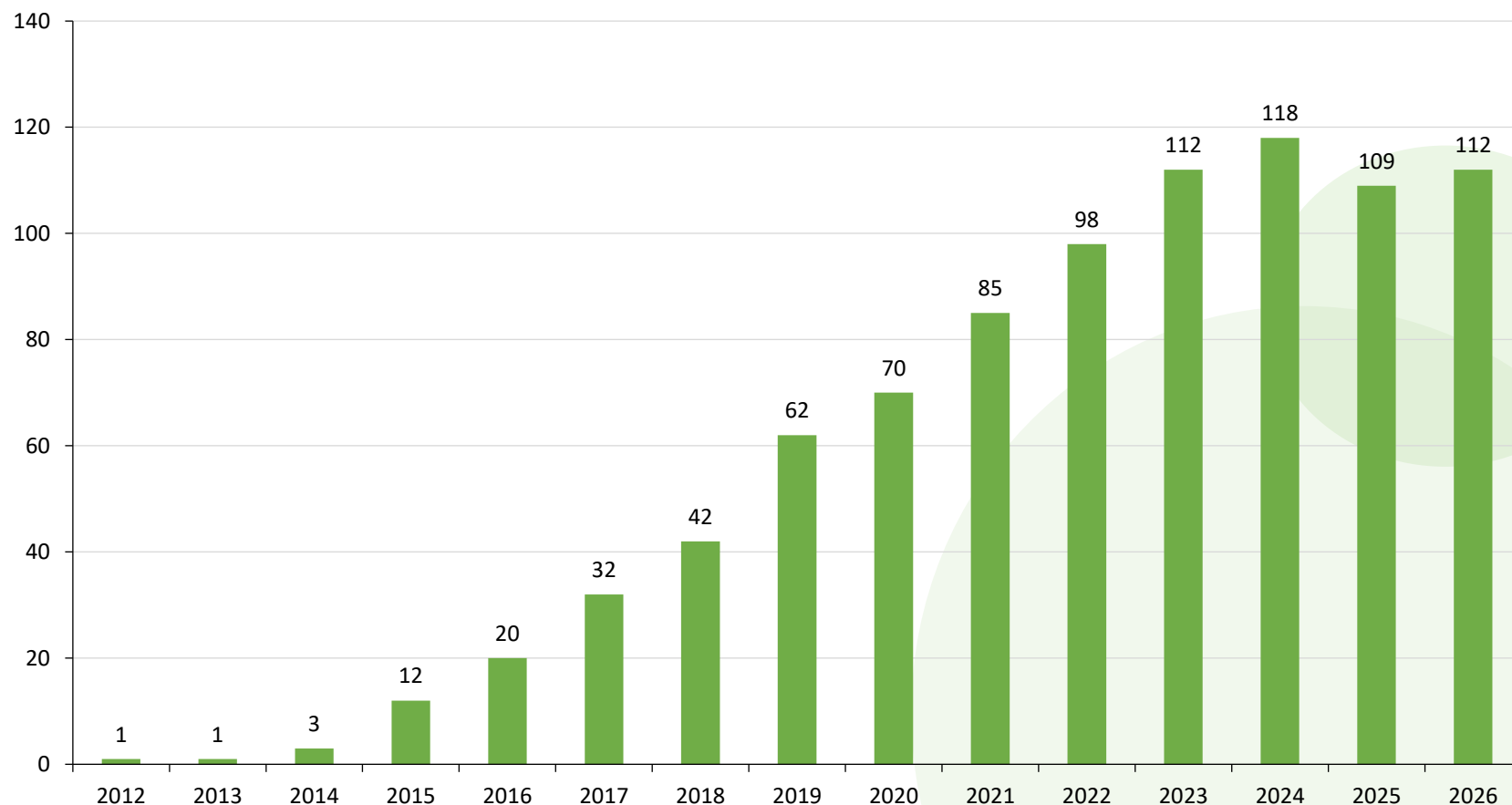
- GGCS publishes a quarterly update of activity within the Scheme.

Number of GGCS Producer Accounts

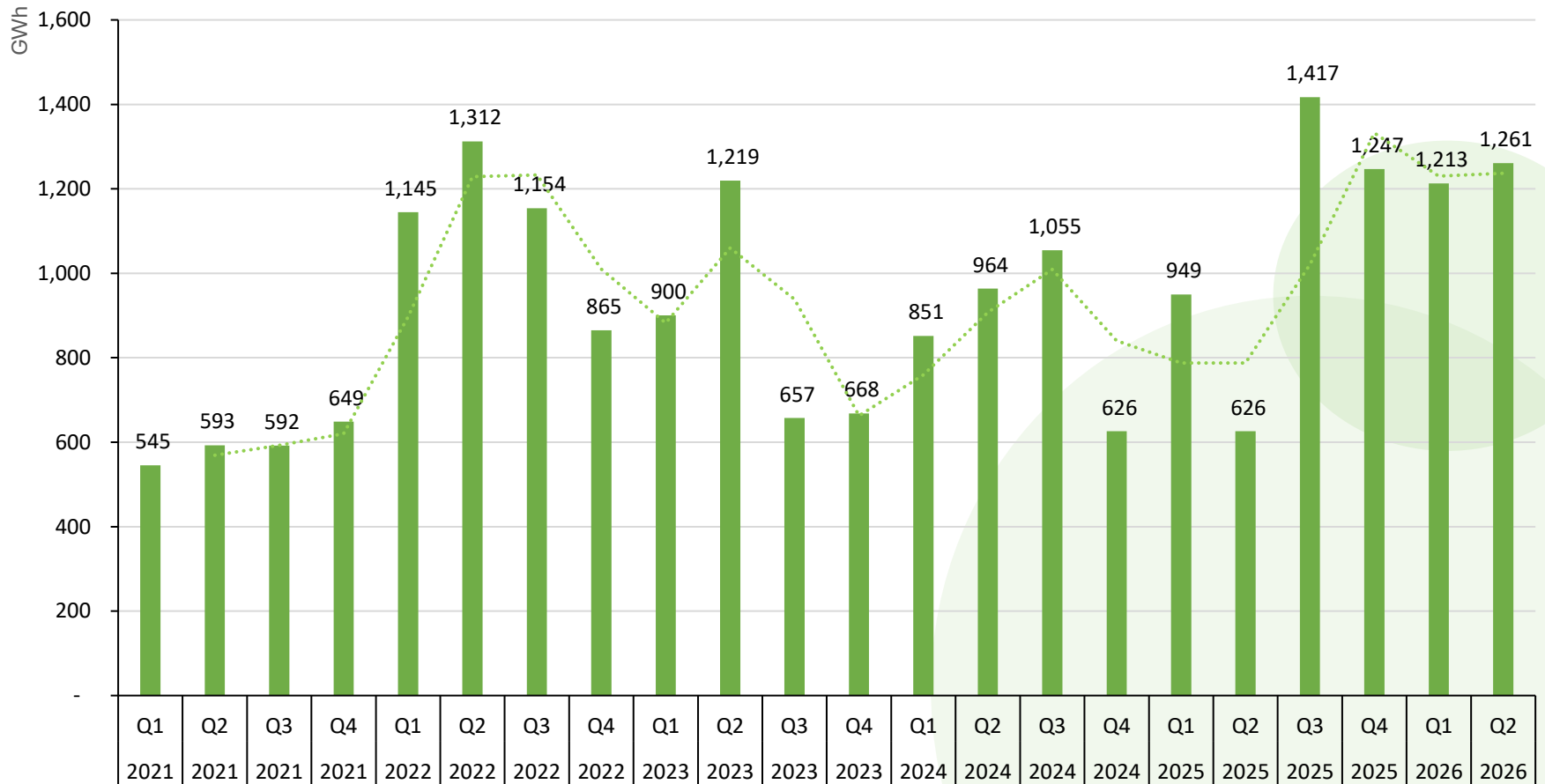


Number of GGCS Trader Accounts

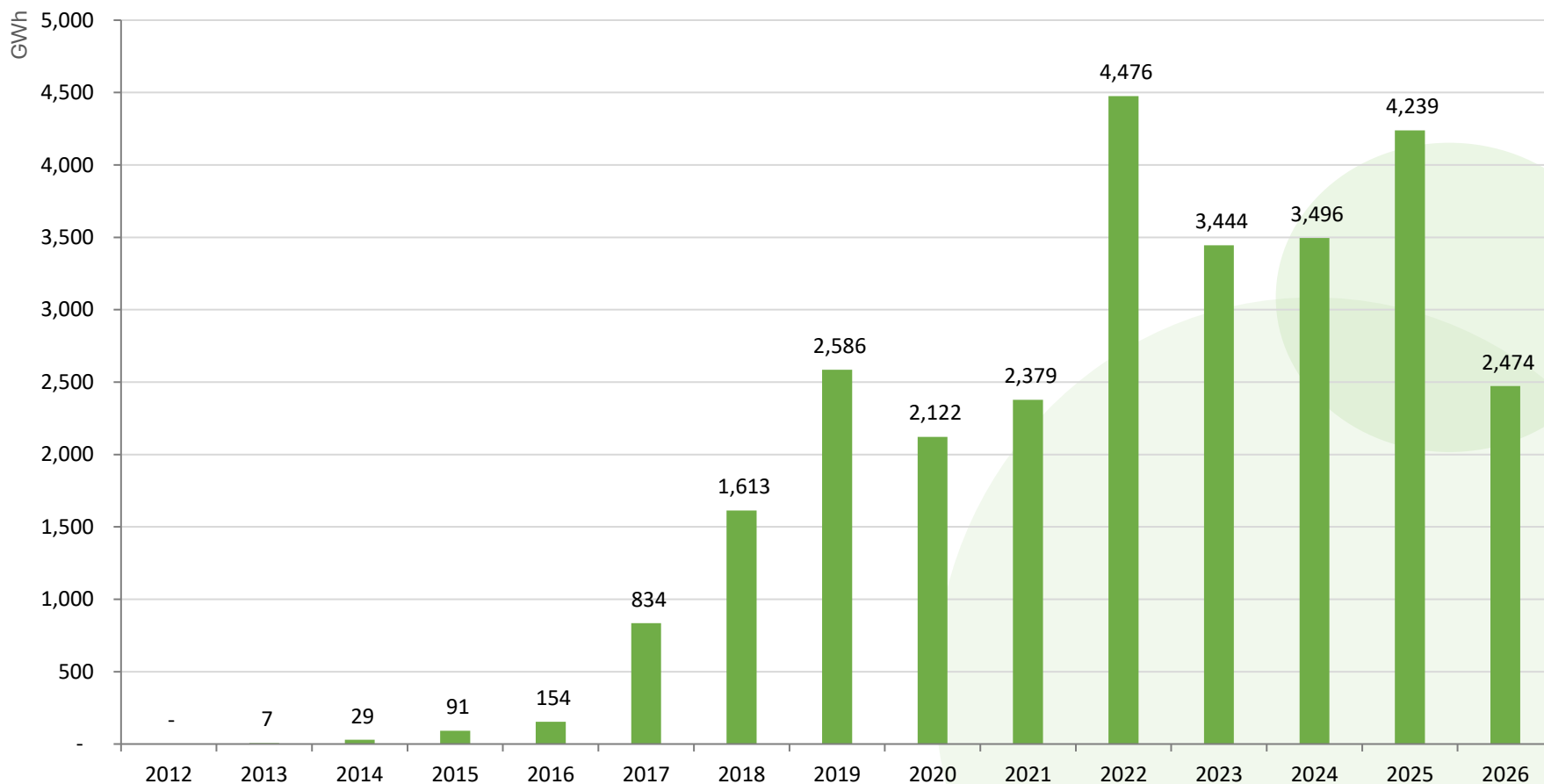
(NB: reduction in 2025 numbers is in part due to closure of accounts linked to producers after integration of trader functions into producer accounts in new IT/G-REX)

RGGOs Exported or Cancelled by Country of Consumption (During Q1 2026)

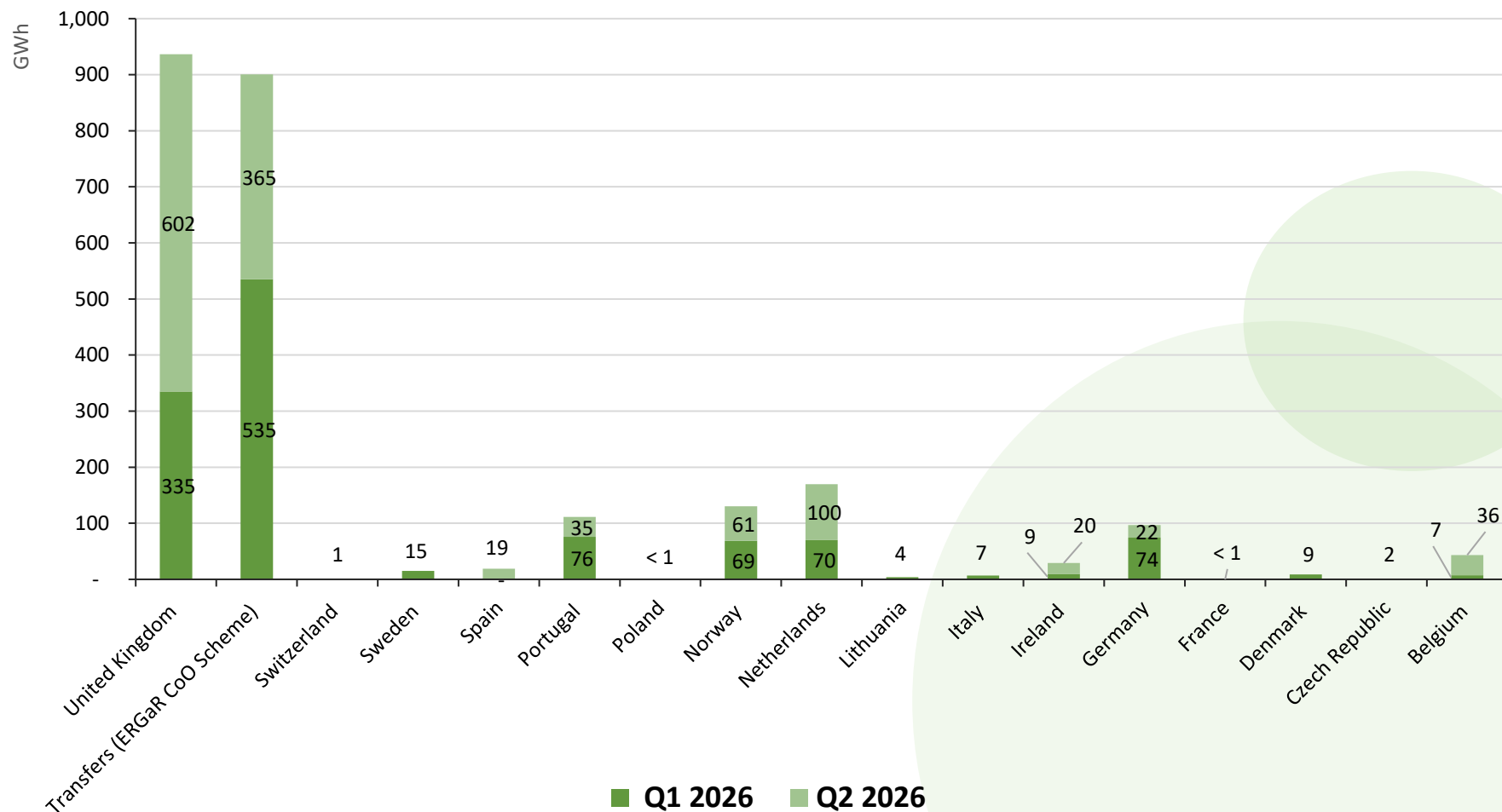
Values are stacked by quarter. Refer to shading colour in key at bottom of graph.

GWh recorded as cancelled outside the UK have been cancelled "ex-domain" i.e. directly from a GGCS account without transfer to another registry, towards gas consumption in the named country.

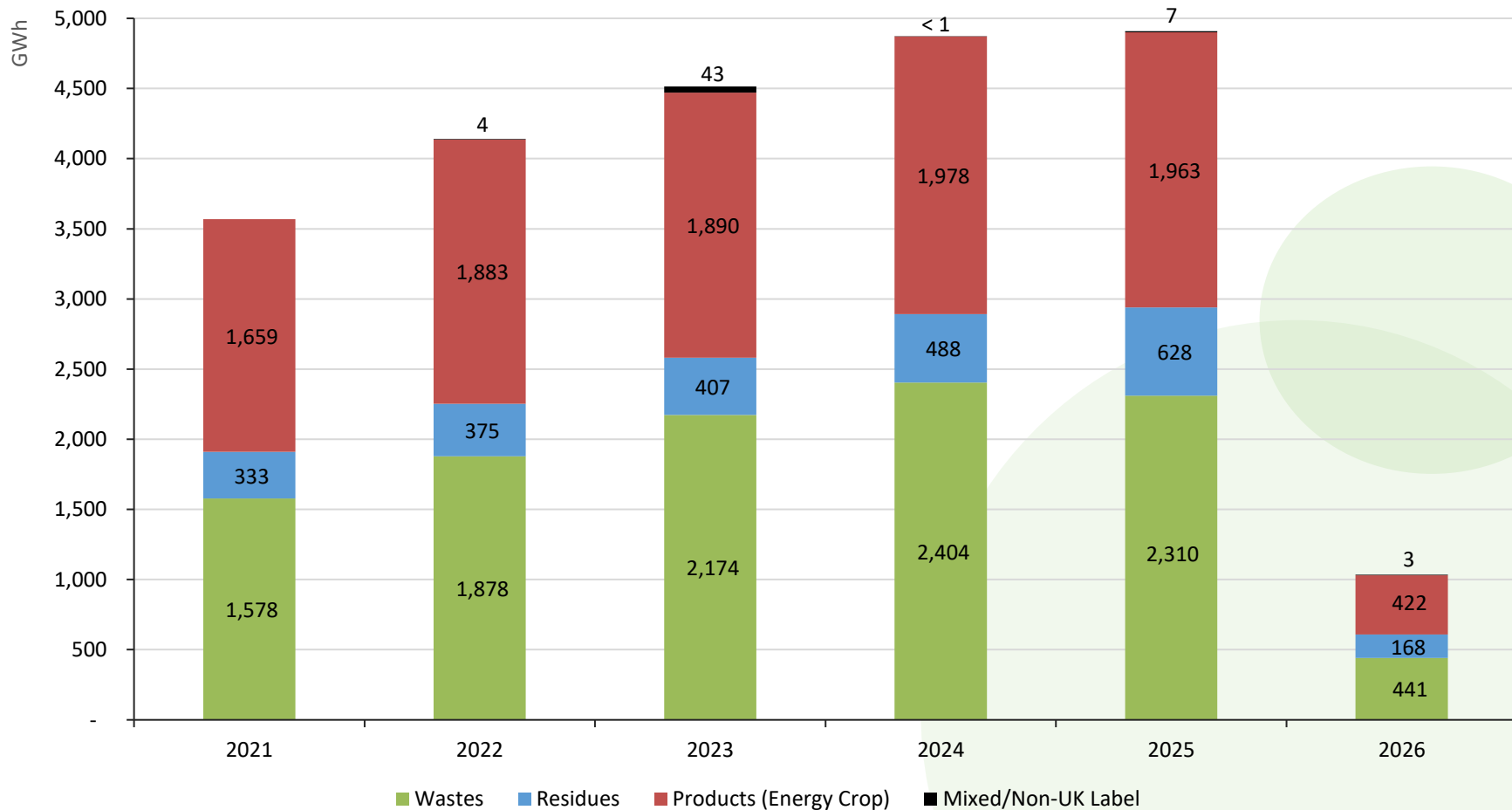
Where RGGOs are exported to another registry, then that registry may or may not cancel those RGGOs for consumption in the same country where that registry is based. We understand both AGCS and DENA allow ex-domain cancellation.

At the end of the year, we will provide a breakdown of UK consumption into domestic, non-domestic, and transport uses.

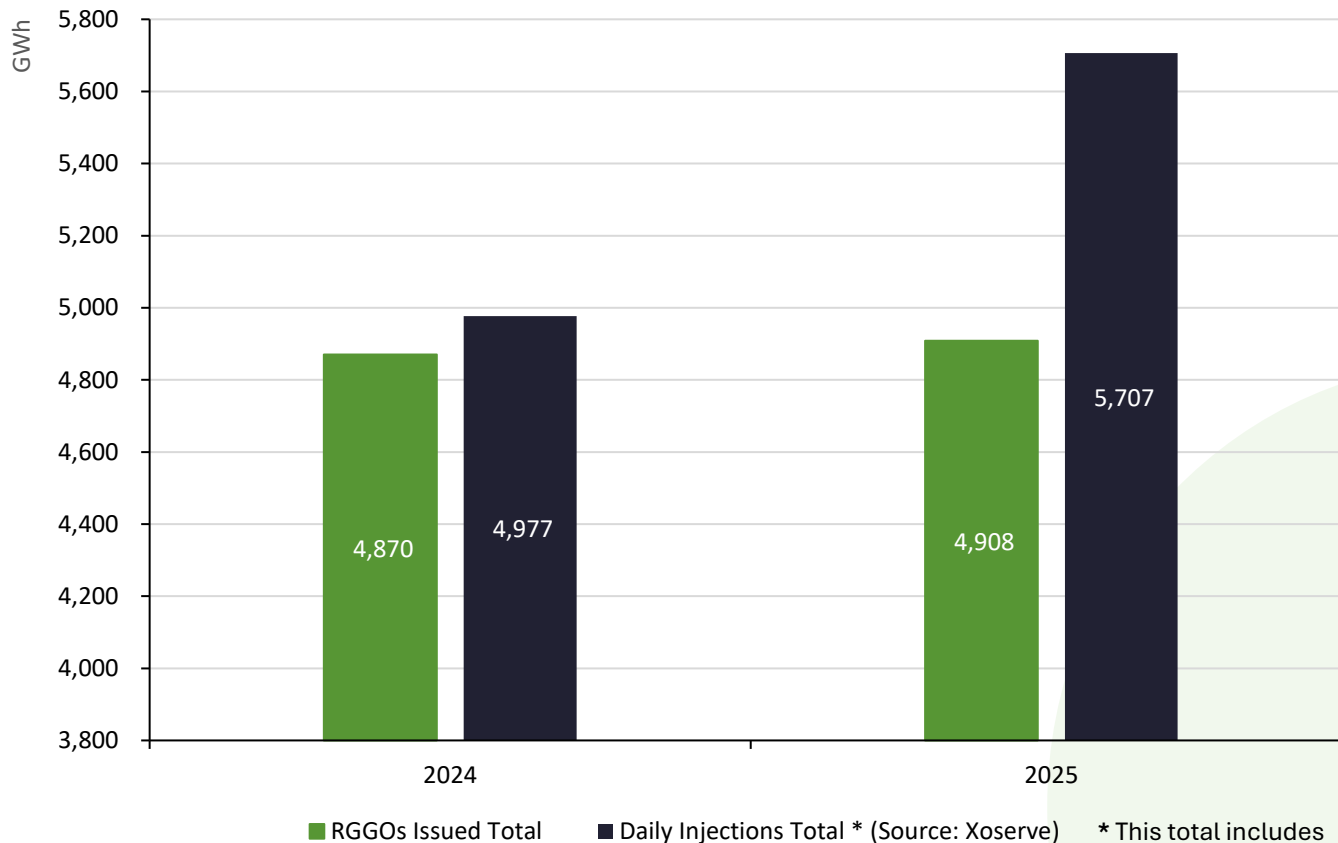
RGGOs Transferred or Cancelled by Country of Consumption (During Q1-Q2 2026)

Comparing Total Daily Injections to RGGOs Issued

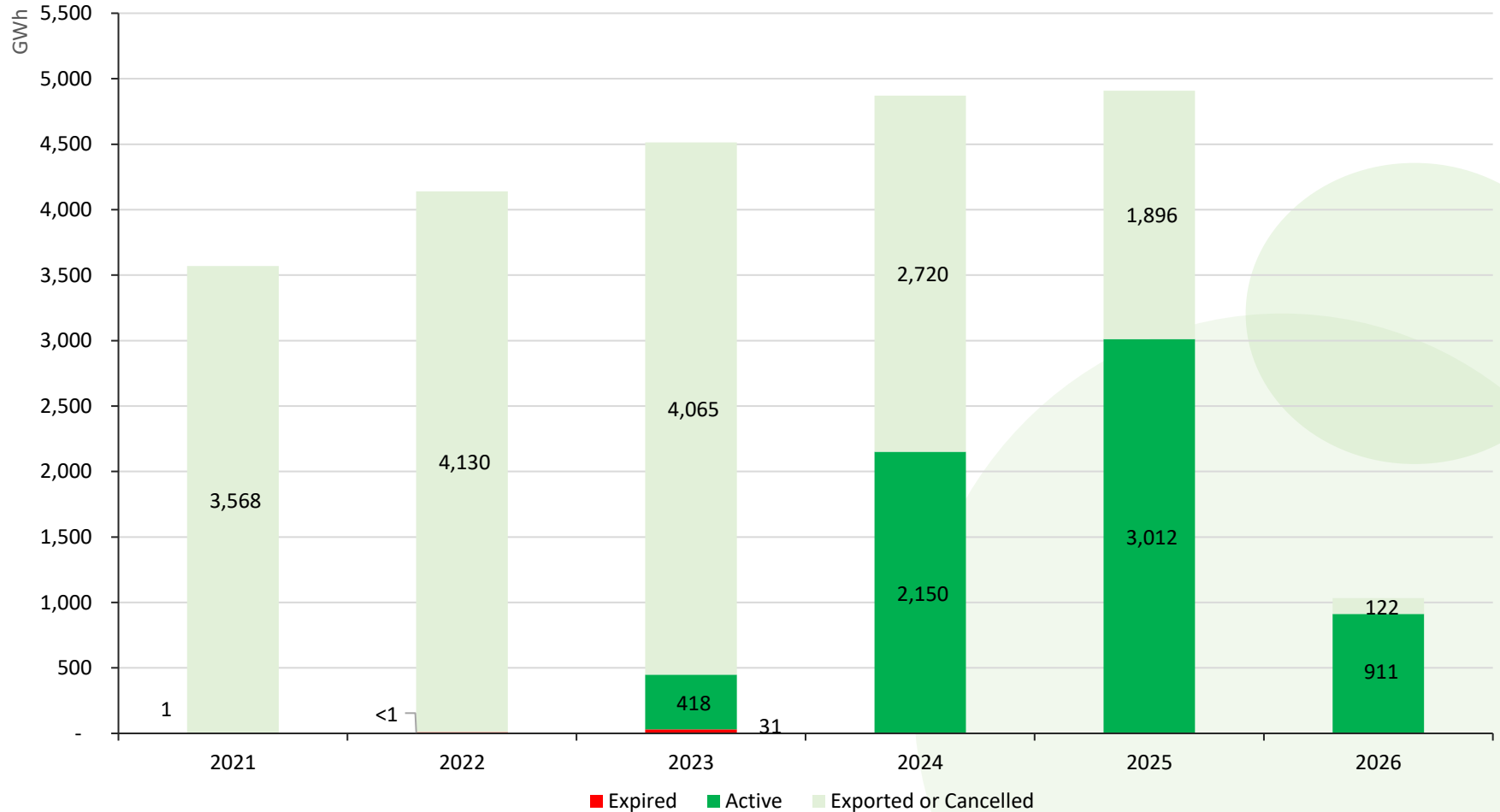


In 2024, RGGOs Issued accounted for 98% of the Daily Injections total for the year.

GGCS estimates that $\approx$ 680 GWh of biomethane is yet to be declared by Producers for 2025 injections.

* This total includes a deduction for default propane content.
